


**MINUTES**  
**BOROUGH OF NEW MILFORD**  
**7:00 PM WORK SESSION**  
**Monday, January 13, 2020**



**WORK SESSION:**

Mayor Putrino read the Open Public Meeting and Mission Statements.

Councilwoman Grant made a motion to go into closed session. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed. Time 7:06 PM.

**CLOSED SESSION:**

1. Personnel – Human Services
2. Review of Closed Session Minutes

At the conclusion of the closed session, Councilwoman Grant made a motion to return to open session. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed. Time 7:19 PM.

Councilwoman Grant made a motion to table the approval of the Closed Session minutes. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

**OPEN SESSION:**

1. Purchase of Duty Weapon

Mayor Putrino referenced a formal request, made through the Police Department, from retired Captain Thomas Johnson to purchase his duty weapon. He said the governing body has considered and approved similar requests in the past.

Councilwoman Duffie made a motion to approve the request. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

## 2. 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Committee

Councilwoman Duffie said she and Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley would like to have four at-large members added to the committee. She said there are a number of honorary members that do not vote and often do not attend meetings and it would be helpful to have additional active members.

Councilwoman Duffie made a motion to add four members to the committee. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

## 3. Proposed Single Use Bag Ordinance

Councilwoman Sandhusen referenced the most recent draft of this ordinance from the Environmental and Energy Commission and asked the governing body move forward to the next step by preparing it for introduction.

Mayor Putrino asked for the Council's consent to have the borough attorney prepare it accordingly.

Councilwoman Grant commented on the penalty amounts for violations. Mr. Kelly said they should be consistent with the Borough's other violation amounts. Councilwoman Grant questioned the minimum amount that could be charged for a bag, suggesting it should be lower and that there should be a maximum as well. After some discussion, all agreed to keep it as drafted.

The Council discussed the effective date, and it was suggested that there should be a firm date, rather than time elapsed from passage of the ordinance.

Councilwoman Sandhusen made a motion to have the attorney format that draft for the governing body's review. Councilwoman Duffie seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

## 4. Proposed Revision to Overnight Parking Regulations

Mr. Kelly referenced the draft language from Lt. DiGenio. He said the intent is to add language to the existing ordinance to permit the Chief to suspend overnight parking regulations. He said the Chief is actually not enforcing the regulation, rather than suspending it, but it has been drafted this way to make it easily understood by the public. He said he believes the ordinance should be modified; he will review applicable statutes and revise the language accordingly. Once revised, he will circulate it to the governing body for review.

Regarding the second page of the memo from Lt. DiGenio, which lists streets that are exceptions to the ordinance, the Administrator will compare the list to the existing ordinance to confirm that no streets have been added to the exception list.

5. Approval of the minutes from the January 6, 2020 Reorganization

Councilwoman Duffie made a motion to approve the minutes from the January 6, 2020 Reorganization meeting. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

6. Administrator's Report

The Administrator explained that both she and the Deputy Clerk will be attending the Municipal Clerk's state conference on April 27<sup>th</sup> and asked for the governing bodies consent to change the April meeting dates. Mayor Putrino suggested a combined work and public session on April 20<sup>th</sup>. All present agreed. The revised meeting schedule will be noticed according to law.

The Administrator advised of the state's dates for budget introduction, March 30<sup>th</sup>, and adoption, April 30<sup>th</sup>. She said she is preparing the spreadsheet for the budget committee's review, from the budgets submitted by the department heads. She will then prepare her allocation recommendations in advance of the committee's first meeting with the CFO on February 10<sup>th</sup>.

The Administrator said she will be out of the office from Tuesday, January 28<sup>th</sup> through Friday, January 31<sup>st</sup> attending the International Institute of Municipal Clerk's Region II Conference in Atlantic City. She said the Deputy Administrator/Clerk will cover the Mayor and Council meeting on January 27<sup>th</sup>.

Mayor Putrino said he will be out of town January 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> and Council President Grotsky will act on his behalf.

Councilwoman Duffie made a motion to approve the appointments to the Jr. Fire Department. Councilwoman Grant seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

**COUNCIL:**

Councilwoman Sandhusen said the Environmental Commission recently met and Lynn Torpie was named as the new chairperson. She said the committee is interested in bringing electric chargers to the borough and will be discussing it this year. She said they are sponsoring an awareness event, in the form of the ANJEC film "Bag It" at 6:00 PM on January 29<sup>th</sup> at the Library.

Councilwoman Duffie said the Board of Health continues to review their ordinances and is currently considering revisions to the food handler's licensing ordinance. Councilwoman Duffie

said the Fire Department will be hosting their annual Comedy Night at 7:00 PM on January 25<sup>th</sup> at Company #1.

Councilwoman Grant said none of her committees have met yet this year. She said the Health Department is sponsoring the annual rabies clinic on Saturday, February 8<sup>th</sup> from 10:00 AM to 1:00 PM.

Mayor Putrino said the Historic New Bridge Landing Park Commission met on January 4<sup>th</sup> and voted to table the reorganization meeting until more members could attend. He said HNBLPC did take action, voting to move forward with painting the Steuben House. Mayor Putrino said he has been talking with other Mayor's in anticipation of the start of the Mayor's Wellness Campaign. Mayor Putrino said he will be presenting achievement certificates to members of Junior Football and administering oaths for five Police Department promotions at the January 27<sup>th</sup> public meeting.

### **COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC**

Councilwoman Grant made a motion to open for public comment. Councilwoman Duffie seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

Lauren Maehrlein – 230 McKinley Avenue. Ms. Maehrlein said she is in favor of the single use plastic bag ban and read a letter from ANJEC in which they advised that the State has yet to take action and encouraged municipalities to continue to adopt local ordinances banning single use plastic bags.

Being no other member of the public who wished to comment, Councilwoman Grant made a motion to close to the public. Councilwoman Duffie seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

### **VOTE ON RESOLUTIONS**

Councilwoman Grant made a motion to approve the consent agenda, consisting of resolutions 2020:54 through 2020:60. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

Mr. Kelly referenced a question raised earlier, with regard to the line of succession to the mayoralty. He said the ordinance is silent beyond the position of Council President. He said the bylaws identify the longest, consecutively serving Councilmember with regard to running a meeting, but they are silent with regard to acting in the capacity as Mayor.

Being no further business before the Council, Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley made a motion to adjourn. Councilwoman Grant seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed. Time 8:08 PM.
