Being no further comment from the public on the application, Councilman Ashley made a motion to close to the public. Councilman Robalino seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

**PRESENTATION: PD HEADQUARTERS DESIGN**

Mayor Subrizi introduced Robbie Conley from Robbie Conley Architect, LLC. Mr. Conley said he presented a police building design to the Mayor and Council two months ago. At that time there was a vote to move forward to construction documents but shortly thereafter he was asked to look into taking the second floor off and to redesign a single story building within the same footprint. He said would be presenting a comparison of the original design and the redesign.

Mr. Conley started with the updated site plan. He said it has been reviewed by the Borough's Police Chief and engineer, and answers the questions previously raised. Mr. Conley pointed out features including the refueling area, the dumpster, underground drainage area, driveways and entrances. Parking was explained briefly by the engineer. She noted there will be 133 parking spaces; an increase of 22 spaces from the current amount.

Showing the two story concept, Mr. Conley presented another slide with areas shown in color to clarify different sections within the two story plan. He explained the areas, breaking them down to their various rooms, and locations within the building using primary adjacency. He explained that mostly administration has been located on the second floor including the Chief of Police's office, lieutenants, detectives, conference room and civilian services. In the basement are utility operations, locker rooms, showers, storage and the fitness area. There are different levels of security in different sections of the building. Mr. Conley pointed out the different views from various locations and elevations looking at the exterior of the building.

Mr. Conley moved to the one story plan. He pointed out the similarities on the first floor in the two plans. He then spoke about the changes that had to be made to meet the departments' necessary requirements. He explained the basement rooms including the captain's office, and showed what the exterior of the building will look like from different locations and elevations. Council President Colucci asked if the roof designs allow for a cement reinforced attic floor and Mr. Conley said it would and that the attic would be suitable for storage.

Mr. Conley said that in the original approved design and in the new design, the first floor is 6,450 square feet. The second floor in the original approved plan was 4,045 and the basement was 3,820 square feet. He said the total square footage for the two story building is 14,315 square feet. In the redesigned building, the first floor remains the same, the basement grows to 5,152 square feet making the total square footage 11,602. He said the difference between the two designs is less than 3,000 square feet. He broke down in detail the changes in design of the interior spaces for the one story plan, including the significantly reduced detective area and the

captain's office in the basement. He said the Chief and the Captain are on separate floors in this plan, and original conference spaces are compromised, as the lunchroom had to be combined with the conference space. He said the Chief's office and assistant's areas are reduced significantly, creating an issue for file cabinet storage. File cabinets will need to be put into various spots instead of the central location of the Chief's secretary's office. The lieutenants and sergeants office will be reduced to fit less desks and computers, which would cause a problem as each officer is in charge of certain jobs and need their own space which is not possible in the space.

Councilman Ashley asked if the architect is advocating for the two story plan and Mr. Conley said that he was asked to develop a single story plan using the same footprint. Mr. Conley stated he is pointing out the differences between the two plans in the presentation.

Mr. Conley showed a revised rendering of the two story version with the original borough hall and new building flush to each other. He also addressed the mechanical, electrical and plumbing systems. The architect's engineer gave Mr. Conley detailed points to talk about including the cooling equipment and high efficiency gas heating equipment. Mechanical systems will be designed with controllers to optimize energy savings. Savings will be seen in plumbing, water and possibly fixtures. In electrical, high efficiency LED lighting fixtures and controls and solar panels will be considered. He said that although green products generally save energy, there is an initial cost premium associated with them. He is aware the borough wants to keep the building as efficient and green as possible within the budget.

Mr. Conley spoke about the cost of the building. He said the estimate for the approved building was \$4,615,618.00. The revised single story design is \$4,005,194.00.

Council President Colucci asked about the basement in the original plan versus the new plan and was told that in the original plan, the basement was unfinished and not a part of the cost estimate. In the new plan it is counted in the estimate because it is finished space. Council President Colucci asked if anything in the redesign would keep the police department from getting accreditation. Mr. Conley said he did not think so. He went on to say that there are elements in the back of the proposed building that are not part of the existing building. He said these areas are required for accreditation and would need to be added regardless of whether or not a new police station is built or the current building is maintained. Mr. Conley said he spoke to Police Chief Ramaci regarding the building and the Chief is in favor of the two story plan. Chief Ramaci said he does not think the one story plan is as functional as the two story building.

Councilman Alonso said that he thinks it is fiscally responsible to build the two story police station now and not in a way that a second story could be built in the future. He asked Mr. Conley what the projected cost would be to add a second level later. Mr. Conley said at 4,000 square feet, using \$300 to \$350 per square foot to build it would be about \$1.2 million which is twice as much as it would cost to build now. Mayor Subrizi said that when factoring in a second floor in the future, taking the roof off the building and adding a new roof would need to be factored in. Mr. Conley said a roof on this building is about \$50 to \$60 thousand, maybe more. Mayor Subrizi said the difference between the original plan and the redesign is 2,713 square feet, however with the eliminations made, there is only a difference of 1,312 square feet.

Councilman Cabrera said he still hates the design, mostly because of its location rather than the size. Mr. Conley said he was originally requested to design the new police building behind the town hall to allow for a connection to bring prisoners directly into the courtroom. He said he was also asked to design a building that did not take away from the grandeur of existing borough hall. Mr. Conley said that he would need to check into accreditation regulations as well as state court standards prior to making any other modifications. Mr. Cabrera asked the Council if they are willing to look into other options.

Mayor Subrizi stated the governing body requested Mr. Conley to design a way to keep the prisoners out of the main lobby of the borough hall, because when they do so it puts everyone in the building at risk. She recapped other requests the governing body asked Mr. Conley to provide, including making the addition smaller. She said it is her belief that the two story building which was approved two months ago is in fact the building the borough needs and Mr. Conley is the architect who can do that for us.

Councilman Cabrera disagreed with the Mayor and said some former Council members asked Mr. Conley to come up with a different design and he never did. He said we have only had one design and he would like to look at all options. He suggested two more designs. One bumped out similar to the new police building Tenafly built. Mr. Cabrera explained the configuration of the building. The second option he suggested is an independent building that lines up with the borough building. All the parking spaces would be behind borough hall and not encroaching on the green space.

Councilman Ashley moved to table the discussion until the plans can be further reviewed. Councilman Cabrera seconded the motion.

On the advice of Mr. Madaio a short discussion was allowed prior to the vote.

Councilman Robalino stated the topic of the police station has been through different committees, Councils, plans, prices, budgets and so forth. He feels the plan presented two months ago was one that worked and the borough would outgrow the revised one story plan sooner rather than later.

Mayor Subrizi asked about a recent meeting between Councilman Cabrera, Council members elect Grant and Sirocchi-Hurley and the Tenafly architect who spoke to Chief Ramaci about an overview of the police department's needs. A discussion ensued regarding the meeting which was held at the borough hall building. She asked what gave them the right to show Mr. Conley's plans to another architect. Councilman Cabrera said he did not show the other architect the plans they were just at the meeting, he did not know how they got there. Councilman Alonso said by meeting with the other architect they could subject the borough to civil litigation for tortious interference with a contract.

The Mayor asked if everyone was ready to vote to table discussion of the police station.

At the time of the vote Councilman Putrino stated he wanted time to look at the past and current plans and costs.

At the time of the vote Mayor Subrizi said she is voting no because the Mayor and Council are acting as a committee as the whole because they could not make any progress in sub-committee and because the police department plans need to be discussed as a committee of the whole. She stated that she feels every plan brought forward never gets the consensus needed. She said each time the governing body receives a revised plan the architect cannot be asked to make it smaller or move it.

Councilman Putrino said that after the last approval, Mr. Conley received requests from the Mayor and a Councilperson to change the plan. He said all members of the governing body have made requests for changes.

Mayor Subrizi stated the two-story plan was approved and there is a motion to go out to bid. Due diligence has been done at this meeting to see if the building could be made smaller. Council President Colucci stated that the site plan was rectified and asked Councilman Putrino if he is now agreeable to it. Councilman Putrino said he was not agreeable to it and there are things he liked about the other building, although the now rectified site plan was the major thing.

Mayor Subrizi said the only time the governing body can discuss proposed plans are when everyone is together. She said it is her opinion that the original, two story plan is most economical because there is already discussion on adding a second level to a one story building.

Councilman Alonso said the police have requirements that must be met for public safety and other reasons. He voted for the two story plan two months ago because he felt it was fiscally responsible for present and future needs of the police department. It also makes financial sense to build the two story building now as it will be less expensive in the end as opposed to adding on in the future. He said that the Chief's input is important because the Chief knows what plan is functional for his department. The Council should adhere to what the Chief advises and asked if Chief Ramaci would give his recommendation.

Chief Ramaci thanked Councilman Alonso for giving him the opportunity to offer his opinion. He pointed out the project began prior to his appointment as Chief. He said the architect had been given criteria to which included the location of the building, and a list of needs that had to be fulfilled. The original plan was downsized and the concern now is that when the plan is approved the new building will be the same size as the existing one and the project money will be wasted. Chief Ramaci said we have to move forward and look to the future. He said he is satisfied with the design of the original two-story building. He stated one story building has many areas that are not going to function properly.

Chief Ramaci said he will have to contact the Department of Corrections when the plan is finalized and approved by the Mayor and Council as they will need to approve certain areas such as the detention facility and sally port.

Councilman Robalino said that he was glad to have seen the one story plan because in by comparison he realizes the smaller building would not work. Chief Ramaci agreed and said the longer the borough waits to build the higher the costs for construction will rise.

Council President Colucci agreed with both Councilman Robalino and Chief Ramaci's comments and made a motion to move forward with the two story plan. Councilman Alonso seconded the motion.

Councilman Putrino stated the one story plan does not meet the needs. He has concerns about the two story plan and he described changes he would like to see made to the plan. He said the site plan is very aggressive and would like to see changes there. If the changes do not work than the present plan is the plan.

Councilman Ashley cautioned the Council referencing a recent newspaper article about Teaneck who transferred their old police station into a municipal building, spending 4.7 million dollars to do so. He said the borough has never looked into what is going to become of the existing police station or if it could have been remodeled.

Councilman Cabrera said the Mayor and Council only saw the one option and not others. He said it is his opinion the governing body is rushing to move this one idea forward rather than looking at other plans that could possibly save money and give the police department a really good police station.

Councilman Alonso said it is disingenuous to say there haven't been other options over the years and it is never easy spending taxpayer money. There is evidence supporting the project and he is voting for the future.

Mayor Subrizi asked Chief Ramaci to comment on the square footage of the processing area, the holding cells and sally port, noting the balance is the meat of the police station. She asked for the square footage of the building minus those areas. Mr. Conley said without those areas it is 11,649 square feet. Mayor Subrizi said this is what needs to be built to provide the proper flow and work well for the police. This plan gives the police a safe place to process prisoners and where the safety of the borough can be met on a modern and go forward basis.

**ADOPT ORDINANCE 2015:22**

BOND ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE ACQUISITION OF NEW GARBAGE TRUCKS FOR THE USE OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS IN, BY AND FOR THE BOROUGH OF NEW MILFORD, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$485,000 TO PAY THE COST THEREOF, TO MAKE A DOWN PAYMENT, TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS TO FINANCE SUCH APPROPRIATION AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH BONDS

Council President Colucci made a motion to close to the public. Councilman Cabrera seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

Council President Colucci made a motion to adopt this ordinance on the second and final reading. Councilman Robalino seconded the motion. The motion carried on a roll call vote. All present in favor, none opposed.

**ADOPT ORDINANCE 2015:23**

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER VII OF THE ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF NEW MILFORD ENTITLED "TRAFFIC," THEREBY AMENDING SECTION 7-9 ENTITLED "BUS STOPS"

Council President Colucci made a motion to open to the public for comment on this ordinance. Councilman Alonso seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

Joseph Klimcak – 163 River Lane. Mr. Klimcak commented on a bus that stopped in front of Shop Rite and blocked the exit. Mayor Subrizi said that is one of the stops this ordinance looks to eliminate.

Being no other member of the public wishing to comment, Councilman Robalino made a motion to close to the public. Councilman Putrino seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

### 4. Prospect Street Parking Ordinance

The Mayor noted the enforcement was put on hold until after the holidays. She referenced a letter from another resident with positive feedback on the restriction. Councilman Putrino said he thinks the ordinance was the right course of action but there have been some hang-ups because the American Legion lot cannot be fully utilized at this time. Mayor Subrizi said it was a legitimate effort on the Council's part to do good for the neighborhood. She said given the ordinance has been adopted, with winter upon us, she feels we should give the ordinance a six month run as is. Councilman Putrino agreed; he said with parking on both sides it makes it difficult to get emergency vehicles through there. The Council agreed to enforce the ordinance as adopted beginning January 1, 2016 for a period of six months, at which time it can be revisited. Letters will be sent to the residents of Prospect Street to inform them of the decision.

Mayor Subrizi said she would like to add an additional item to the closed session agenda, under the heading of legal advice, to be discussed at the conclusion of the public session.

## **COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC**

Councilman Robalino made a motion to open the meeting for public comment. Councilman Putrino seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

Joseph Klimcak – 163 River Road.

Mr. Klimcak referenced his attendance at the last meeting. He thanked Mr. Cabrera for referencing the thirteen second gap in the recording of the last meeting. He mentioned the previous Property Maintenance Officer's report. He questioned the Mayor regarding the findings in the report and asked the Council why there was no pursuit of the violation. Mr. Madaio said this is public comment, not public debate. He said if Mr. Klimcak has a comment he should make the comment but no one is obligated to respond in any way. He said he asked the Mayor why she did not accept the former Property Maintenance Officer's report. Mr. Madaio said he believes the Mayor responded that several of Mr. Klimcak's underlying premises were inaccurate but nevertheless that was her position. Mr. Klimcak said he has no choice but to file criminal charges against the Mayor for obstruction of justice. Councilman Cabrera confirmed the PMO report to which Mr. Klimcak referred was an official report from January 2015.

Hedy Grant – 175 Boulevard.

Ms. Grant said last year when she served on the PD Headquarters committee she asked several times for plans for a building in a different location. She said she was assured that they would get them but they were never presented. She said she agrees with Councilman Putrino the site plan makes things very complicated. She said all of the plans we have seen over the last three years are

virtually the same. She asked would it not have been proper to open to the public for comment on the presentation prior to making a motion and taking a vote. Mr. Madaio said that could have been done but there is no obligation to do so.

Bill Martin – 1115 River Road

Mr. Martin said he is disappointed with the railroading of the police station. He said many from the public have proposed other alternatives. He thanked Councilman Putrino and Councilman Ashley for their service.

Councilman Alonso made a motion to close to the public. Councilman Ashley seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.
