Council President Duffie read the Open Public Meeting and Mission Statements.

OPEN SESSION:

1. United Water/NJDEP Letters – Water Supply vs. Flooding

This matter was tabled as it had been listed for discussion by Mayor Subrizi.

2. Parking Ordinance Recommendation – Ambulance Corps Lot

The Administrator explained this was referred to the Mayor and Council after the ordinance had already been revised to address parking at all of the Borough lots. Lt. Jones, the Traffic Officer, issued a memo dated May 15, 2014, whereby he asked to amend the ordinance as it pertains to the Ambulance Corps parking lot. Lt. Jones acknowledged the ordinance is silent with regard to overnight parking, addressing only the hours of 9:00 AM to 6:00 PM. He said residents of River and Main, without access to off-street parking, have been permitted to park overnight in this lot. Lt. Jones has proposed an amendment to the ordinance to continue to allow resident parking overnight but to prohibit businesses from using this lot to store their vehicles or vehicles belonging to their customers. He suggested adding "Parking/Storage of any vehicle for a commercial purpose" to the list of prohibitions. The Council discussed the wording. The attorney recommended and the Council agreed it should read "no commercial parking overnight." The ordinance will be prepared for introduction on June 9th with a public hearing scheduled for June 23rd.

3. Silver Award Project Proposal

The Administrator reviewed the proposal for exercise cards to be placed at stations at Prospect Park. She said she reviewed the proposal with the Risk Manager who advised there would

need to be an exact plan depicting each exercise and the proposed location and the exercises need to be endorsed by a recognized expert in the field. Mr. Leibman suggested requesting a detailed proposal. The Administrator suggested the scout may need to speak with the Recreation Commission. Councilman Ashley concurred; if it will be on a Recreation field it will need approval from the Recreation Director. The Council all indicated approval of the concept and the scout will be referred to the Recreation Commission to finalize the proposal. The Administrator will notify the Recreation Commission and the scout.

4. Mayor Moscaritolo's Letter to PSE&G

Councilwoman Grant referenced the letter from River Edge Mayor, Sandy Moscaritolo to PSE&G regarding their lack of care to the foliage around their plant near Historic New Bridge Landing. Councilwoman Grant suggested the Council may wish to send a similar letter. All agreed to send a letter. Councilwoman Grant will draft the letter for the Council's approval.

5. Administrator's Report

The Administrator said the Primary Election is Tuesday, June 3rd and polls will be open from 6:00 AM to 8:00 PM.

The Administrator reported the St. Joseph Rocket Club will be launching their rockets on June 3rd at 3:30 PM behind the Borough Hall. Spectators are welcome.

The Administrator reminded the Council the June work session is less than two weeks away on June 9th.

The Administrator referenced two resolutions, forwarded after the agenda, for the Council's consideration. The first is a resolution to authorize an agreement to provide for a construction easement on the property adjacent to Fire Co. #2. She said the need for the easement became evident at the end of the previous week and the attorney worked with the Fire Department to draft the necessary agreement. Mr. Leibman explained the agreement in detail. The resolution proposed authorizes the Mayor to sign the agreement. In order to minimize any delays to the construction the Administrator suggested the Council may wish to add it to the current agenda. The Council concurred, the resolution was added as 2014:143. The Administrator explained the second resolution was to activate a clause in her contract to provide for \$2,500 to be added to her base for 2014 upon the approval of the Council. She said the money was included in the 2014 budget as adopted on April 28, 2014. Councilwoman Grant said since it was approved the prior year it should be memorialized. All agreed to add the resolution as 2014:144.

The Council spent the balance of the work session reviewing the closed session minutes. Councilman Colucci arrived at 7:34 PM.

Councilman Colucci made a motion to approve the April 28, 2014 closed session minutes. Councilwoman Grant seconded the motion. All present in favor, with the exception of Council President Duffie who abstained.

Councilwoman Grant made a motion to approve the May 12, 2014 closed session minutes. Councilman Robalino seconded the motion. All present in favor, none opposed.

Councilwoman Grant made a motion to reconvene in the Council Chambers. Councilman Robalino seconded the motion. All present in favor, none opposed.

PUBLIC SESSION:

Council President Duffie called the meeting to order, asked for a moment of silent prayer and/or reflection, and led the flag salute. Council President Duffie read the Open Public Meeting Law and Mission Statements and points out the fire exits in the Council Chambers.

**PUBLIC HEARING: NEW MILFORD GREEN ACRES
ACQUISITION OF DEMAREST-GURD-CASEY HOUSE**

The Administrator said the Mayor and Council have authorized Mr. Spatz to make an application on behalf of the Mayor and Council for the acquisition of a historic home in New Milford.

David Spatz of Community Housing & Planning Associates, Inc. said he has been engaged to prepare an application to the Green Acres program to seek funding to acquire the Demarest-Gurd-Casey House which is located at 618 River Road. He said as part of the application process the municipality is required to hold a public hearing. He said in addition to Green Acres funding he will also be pursuing funds from Bergen County Open Space and the New Jersey Office of Historic Preservation. Mr. Spatz said New Milford is eligible under the planning incentive for Green Acres which means the town is eligible for 50% as opposed to 25% matching grant. He said the town is seeking \$700,000 for the acquisition in addition to \$35,000 for soft costs such as appraisals and environmental assessment. He said the application is due July 15th.

Councilwoman Grant asked if the 7/15 deadline was just for the Green Acres application. Mr. Spatz said that it is as the other applications have not been announced as of yet.

Councilman Colucci asked if Mr. Spatz has spoken to the owner with regard to the purchase price should the appraisals come in lower or the grants do not cover the entire purchase price. Mr. Spatz said he would speak to the owner should that come to pass. Councilman Colucci asked how long the

said he would speak to the owner should that come to pass. Councilman Colucci asked how long the town will have to aggregate the funds. Mr. Spatz said we should know by the Fall or by the end of the year how much money we will be able to get and whether or not we will need to go into another round of applications. Mr. Colucci asked if Mr. Spatz had done any other historic projects in Bergen County. Mr. Spatz said he did the Green Acres application for Bergenfield for Cooper Pond Park and he has done fifteen or twenty applications in Hudson County.

Council President Duffie suggested Mr. Leibman may be able to speak to the issue of negotiation with the owner. Mr. Leibman said any negotiation over the price with the property owner would be discussed by the Council in closed session and it would be conveyed privately to the property owner.

Councilman Ashley made a motion to open to the public for comment with regard to this application. Councilwoman Grant seconded the motion. All present in favor, none opposed.

John Rutledge – 335 River Road. Mr. Rutledge asked if the town acquires the property will the owner vacate the property. He was advised the owner would vacate the property. He asked if the property would be held in perpetuity as a historic site. He was advised that it already is and will continue to be. Mr. Spatz said it must remain as a historic property both by virtue of it being on the State and National Registers as well as being acquired by these funds. Mr. Rutledge asked about the proposed use and if there had been any consideration to linking it with the Bergen County Historical Society. Council President Duffie said she would think that would definitely be part of the idea of how to repurpose the home since it connects the history of New Milford to the history of the country. She said that to be able to preserve it in its historic state it should be used and seen and she said the each member of the Council has an idea of what they would like to see there. She said when the time comes she is sure the Council will discuss it with the help of the Planner and the Historic Preservation Commission. She said it will be a full discussion. Mr. Rutledge asked about the upkeep after acquisition and if the expense is to be absorbed by the town. He was advised the upkeep would be at the town's expense. Councilman Colucci said there may be additional grants available to maintain the historic significance.

As there were no further comments from the public the hearing was closed on a motion from Councilman Ashley, seconded by Councilman Robalino. All present in favor, none opposed.

PRESENTATION: TROOP 78 – BOY SCOUTS

The scouts were recognized for their significant effort to provide snow shoveling services to the seniors of New Milford during a very long winter.

APPOINTMENTS: GUS BACHMANN – SENIOR ADVISORY BOARD

Councilman Putrino made a motion to approve the appointment. Councilman Robalino seconded the motion. All present in favor, none opposed.

COUNCIL COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Councilman Colucci made a motion to file Committee Reports with the Borough Clerk to be spread in full upon the minutes. Councilwoman Grant seconded the motion. All present in favor, none opposed.

Council President Duffie congratulated the Public Events Committee for the outstanding job they did with the Memorial Day Parade. She also extended thanks to the Beautification Committee for their hard work on Holland Avenue.

OLD BUSINESS:

Councilman Robalino made a motion to approve the minutes from the May 12, 2014 work session. Councilman Putrino seconded the motion. All present in favor, none opposed.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER VII OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF NEW MILFORD ENTITLED "TRAFFIC", THEREBY AMENDING SUBSECTION 7-3 ENTITLED "PARKING"

Councilwoman Grant made a motion to open to the public for comment on this ordinance. Councilman Putrino seconded the motion. All present in favor, none opposed.

Steven Segal – 291 Reichelt Road. Mr. Segal said he wanted to comment on the parking restrictions in the vicinity of the Brookchester apartments. Council President Duffie explained comments were restricted to this ordinance but he would be given the opportunity to speak on any matter later in the meeting.

Given no further comment from the public on this ordinance, Councilman Ashley made a motion to close to the public. Councilman Putrino seconded the motion. All present in favor, none opposed.

Councilman Colucci made a motion to adopt this ordinance on its second and final reading. Councilman Putrino seconded the motion. The motion passed on a roll call vote. All present in favor, none opposed.

COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

Councilman Putrino made a motion to open to the public. Councilwoman Grant seconded the motion. All present in favor, none opposed.

Steven Segal – 291 Reichelt Road. Mr. Segal said he has never, in his lifetime, had a moving violation but in the last five months he has received two parking tickets. He said the parking is very limited in area surrounding the Brookchester apartments and there is an inconsistency in the enforcement of the overnight parking restrictions. He said he understands it is a quality of life issue for the residents of the area but it is not a gated community. Mr. Segal suggested a sticker program for Brookchester residents which would provide a clear picture for police officers as to who is parked there. Councilman Robalino mentioned that overnight parking restrictions are lifted at certain times during the year such as the summer and over the winter holidays. He also suggested that Mr. Segal could contact the police department to request permission to park overnight on an emergency basis. Councilman Ashley acknowledged all of Mr. Segal’s comments as being true, it is very inconvenient for the residents of Brookchester and a quality of life issue for the residents of the area. Councilman Ashley said that the Council is working on a solution but it is not a short term solution. Councilman Colucci said the suggestion of parking stickers has been discussed on a number of occasions in the past but has not gotten enough support to be implemented. Council President Duffie thanked him for his input and suggested he may want to share some of his ideas with the Borough Traffic Officer or the Chief of Police.

Councilman Putrino asked a member of the audience if there was still a problem with a State Trooper parking in a no parking zone at Boulevard and Bulger. He was advised the problem is ongoing.

John Rutledge – 335 River Road. Mr. Rutledge asked for an update of the newly formed committee for police headquarters. Councilwoman Grant said the committee has met once and will be meeting again the following week.

Councilman Putrino made a motion to close the meeting to public comment. Councilman Colucci seconded the motion. All present in favor, none opposed.

VOTE ON RESOLUTIONS

Councilman Ashley asked to have resolution 2014:134 pulled from the consent agenda.

Councilwoman Grant made a motion to approve the consent agenda consisting of resolution 2014:133 and resolutions 2014:135 through 2014:144. Councilman Colucci seconded the motion. The motion passed on a roll call vote. All present in favor, none opposed.

Councilman Robalino made a motion to approve resolution 2014:134. Councilman Colucci seconded the motion. The motion passed on a roll call vote as follows:

Council President Duffie announced the Council would be going into closed session and upon reopening, the meeting would be adjourned.

Councilwoman Grant announced a joint celebration of the Historic Preservation Commission and the Library Board of Trustees scheduled for June 8, 2014.

Councilman Putrino said the budget committee has completed the budget outline and it will be posted to the website upon final review of the committee and the CFO.

Councilman Putrino referenced the Little Ferry Street Opening ordinance and asked to have the attorney review it to provide a recommendation as to what could or should be added to New Milford's ordinance. He made particular note of the section that requires repaving of anything opened within five years of it being paved.

Councilman Putrino asked if Mayor Subrizi had submitted the end of the year OEM report. The Administrator responded she had not.

Councilwoman Grant asked the status of the Brookchester rezoning. Mr. Leibman said he needs a copy of the Planning Board resolution and then it should be listed on the Mayor and Council agenda to reintroduce the ordinance. The ordinance will then be sent to the Planning Board for review. The Planning Board has thirty-five days to take action and if they do not take action the Mayor and Council can move forward. The ordinance will be prepared for introduction at the meeting of June 9th.

Councilman Colucci made a motion to go into closed session. Councilman Robalino seconded the motion. All present in favor, none opposed.
